Elementary School "Show and Tell Nepal" Contest (Grades 1 – 5)

The Nepalese Association in Southeast America (NASeA) and the Association of Nepalese in Midwest America (ANMA) are announcing the annual elementary school student "Show and Tell" contest open to all elementary school student living in North America.

It is very important that we continue to keep our children aware of their Nepali origin and strive to keep them aware of Nepali culture. The earlier this awareness is inculcated, the better it is. Therefore, the goal of the writing contest is to increase awareness of Nepali heritage among our young generation.

The elementary school "Show and Tell" contest is personally sponsored by Mr. Madhav Mainali and Ms. Sita Mainali of Huntsville, Alabama.

Show and Tell: Lost Heritage of Nepal

Assume that you have to do a "Show-and-tell", except instead of telling, you will be writing. Choose one famous Nepali temple, building, or place that has been destroyed or damaged by the recent earthquake in Nepal. Ask your parents to provide a picture of the object and write about it. Please do not forget to send us your picture along with your writing.

(Guideline: 1. Write about any historically significant temple, building, or place that has been damaged/destroyed by the recent earthquake in Nepal. 2. Attach a picture of your show and tell).

Eligibility:

- 1. The content is open to all North American Region elementary school students enrolled in 2015-2016 and to all home- school students in grade equivalent to elementary school (Grade 1 -5).
- 2. All "Show and Tell Nepal" must reflect the contestant's own research and originality in writing.
- 3. Limit one submission per student.
- 4. Essay must be submitted online before deadline to all Judging Committee members.

Essay specification:

- 1. Written in English language.
- 2. Student's name, photo, email address and day-time phone number must appear at the top of the essay.
- 3. Document limits to 400-500 words for grade 4th and 5th and 300 -400 words for 1st, 2nd and 3rd grader. All words, except title will be counted towards the word limits.
- 4. Type using MS-Word, double-spaced, page numbered.
- 5. Submit writing in MS-Word format along with the picture of the object to Judging Committee Chair and carbon copy to all committee members.

Timeline:

- 1. Essay Submission Deadline August 10, 2015.
- 2. Winner Notification August 18, 2015.
- 3. Recognition of Winners September 5, 2015 (during cultural program of NASeA/

ANMA/ annual joint convention).

Judging criteria:

- 1. Scope of research (20%)
- 2. Organization of content (15%)
- 3. Originality (20)%
- 4. Logic development (10 %)
- 5. Spelling and grammar (10%)
- 6. Clarity and sincerity of thoughts (10%)
- 7. Completeness (15%)

A panel of official essay contest committee will conduct judging. The committee's decision will be the final decision.
