Eligibility:

- 1. The content is open to all North American Region middle school students enrolled in 2016-2017 and to all home-school students in grade equivalent to middle school (Grades 6-8).
- 2. All essays must reflect the contestant's own research and originality in writing.
- 3. Limit one submission per student.
- 4. Essay must be submitted online before deadline to all Judging Committee members.

Essay specification:

- 1. Written in English language.
- 2. Student's name, photo, email address and day-time phone number must appear at the top of the essay.
- 3. Document limits to 600 700 words. All words, except title and bibliography will be counted towards the word limits.
- 4. Type using MS-Word, double-spaced, page numbered.
- 5. Submit essay in MS-Word format to Judging Committee Chair and carbon copy to all committee members.

Judging criteria:

- 1. Scope of research (20%)
- 2. Organization of content (15 %)
- 3. Originality (20)%
- 4. Logic development (10 %)
- 5. Spelling and grammar (10%)
- 6. Clarity and sincerity of thoughts (10%)
- 7. Completeness (15%)

A panel of official essay contest committee will conduct judging. The committee's decision will be the final decision.

Timeline:

- 1. Essay Submission Deadline August 15, 2016.
- 2. Winner Notification August 20, 2016.
- 3. Winners Recognition During cultural program of 12th ANMA/NASeA joint convention.
